REPORT FROM SCHOLARSHIP SECTION

1. Pre-Matric Scholarship for Minority Students:- This scheme is 100% centrally sponsored with Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) payment mode from the central ministry. Students belonging to Minority group from classes 1 to 10 can avail this scheme. For 2020-21, 53660 fresh and 33361 renewal applications were received by the state through National Scholarship Portal (NSP 2.0). The Merit list generation is yet to be done by the Ministry of Minority Affairs for disbursement of scholarship.

- 2. Pre-Matric Scholarship belonging to Schedule Tribe Students studying in Class IX and X :- This scheme was implemented from Financial Year 2015-16 under the ministry of Tribal Affairs. With the directive received from the Government of India in the year 2019, the department has developed a portal - *Common Scholarship Portal* through which the student can apply their application through online. The Ministry has released an amount of Rs.60, 75,000/- (Rupees Sixty Lakh Seventy Five Thousand only) as arrear for 2019-20, and 1st Instalment (25% of the central Share) for the year 2020-21 has been sanctioned.
- 3. Nagaland Govt. School Students Meritorious Award.(NGSSMA):-This is a state sponsored scheme given to the meritorious students studying in government schools of the state. NGSSM Award is given to the meritorious students (only for the
 - toppers) passing out in different three stages of Final Examinations.
 1. Primary Leaving Certificate Examination (PLCE)
 2. Elementary Leaving Certificate Examination (ELCE)
 3. High School Leaving Certificate (HLSC).

The department has disbursed Rs.14,67,000/- (Rupees Fourteen Lakh Sixty Seven Thousand only) for 438 meritorious students during 2019-2020.

- Grant for children of police Personnel killed in encounter while on duty. This 4. scheme was implemented Vide O.M NO.FIN/ESTT/5-27/75 dated the 14th Jan' 1980. The department has earmarked Rs. 1 Lac every year for this purpose which is sliced in the allocated fund from general scholarship scheme under Non-Plan. Since the allocation amount to the beneficiaries is less, the department gives as lump-sum amount for their admission and school fees upto class 10, provided the Scholar is successful, and subject to his/her good progress record on; (1) Regularity (ii) Good conduct and (iii) good academic result. During the year 2020, the Department has disbursed Rs.99,000/- (Ninety Ninety Thousand only) for 11 students directly into their Account.
- 5. Stipend to Students studying at Govt. Hindi Institute Dimapur. The Department gives Stipend to the Hindi Institute Students every year from the allocated fund under scholarship by the state government. This is the only scholarship avail by the students studying in this institute. From the year 2015-16 one fifty (150) students studying in this institute has availed this stipend @ 400 p.m. During 2020-21 the Department has disburse Rs.3,76,800/- (Three Lakh Seventy Six Thousand Eight Hundred only) to 124 students through their Account.

SCIENCE SECTION

The annual activities of Science section is to conduct **Student's Science Seminar** and **Exhibition** for the secondary students at three levels, i.e. District, State and National level, following the guidelines given by the National Council of Science Museums and Birla Industrial and Technological Museum Kolkata.

During 2020-2021, student's *Science Seminar and Exhibition* could not be carried out due to worldwide pandemic. However, the department is proposing to conduct Virtual Science *Seminar and Exhibition* both in the district as well as in the state level within March 2021.

TRAINING SECTION

- 1. The section organised an *Awareness Talk* in collaboration with CHILDLINE Kohima and District Mental Health Program, Kohima Nagaland on 10th July 2020 which was uploaded and broadcasted in Youtube and All India Radio.
- 2. Organised two days Orientation Programme on Service Rules, Service Matters for the newly recruited LDA Cum- Computer Assistant on the 17th and 18th Feb 2020. Shri. G. Khevishe, Consultant School Education and Shri. Andreas Lotha, Under Secy. Law and Justice, government of Nagaland were the resource person. Altogether 79(seventy-nine) participants attended this programme.



3. The section assisted in organising felicitation programme for GHSS Rank Holders in HSSLC Examination 2020 on 23rd June 2020, at the Morung Conference Hall, Directorate of School Education, Kohima.



4. Deputed 117 In-Service Teachers for undergoing B.Ed study at the various B.Ed. colleges in the state (Online classes started).

5. A policy on *Child Protection Policy* for schools was launched on the 23rd September 2020, at the Secretariat Conference Hall, Kohima by Shri. Menukhol John, Principal Secretary to the government of Nagaland.



6. Assisted in organising One Day Panel Discussion on the *New Education Policy* (NEP) 2020 at the Morung Conference Hall, Directorate of School Education, Kohima on the 5th Dec, 2020.



7. Conducted One Day Sensitization / Seminar on '*Covid-19*' for Grade-IV staffs in the Directorate Office on the 9th Dec 2020, with Dr. Sao Tunyi from Directorate of Health and Family Welfare as the resource person. A total of 35 Grade- IV Staffs attended the programme maintaining all SOP guidelines laid down by the government. On the same day, another session for the directorate drivers on '*Traffic Rules*' was held, with Shri. Chiwasi, 2nd O.C. (traffic) Kohima as the resource person.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION SECTION

The run was participated by the officers from the directorate along with all the Physical Education Teachers serving under Kohima district. The Run culminated at Tin Pati Junction Kohima.



ACTIVITY TO BE TAKEN UP

- 1. The section has proposed to organise the All Nagaland GHSS & GHS tournament once the situation normalises. This is expected to give competition and exposure platform to the students of different categories.
- 2. Proposing to conduct re-orientation training for all Physical Education Teachers (P.E.Ts) of the state, to update and embark knowledge with the latest changing '*Rules and Regulation*' of different games and sports.

Activity report of the Hindi Section for the year 2020-21:

- **1.** <u>In-service Hindi Teachers Training:</u> Altogether eighty (80) candidates were selected for undergoing various professional courses at CIH (Central Institute of Hindi at Agra & Dimapur for the session 2020-21.
 - a) NISHNAT-1 (one) candidate
 - b) Praveen-11 (eleven) candidates
 - c) Vishesh Gahan- 68 (sixty-eight) candidates
- 2. 30 (thirty) Candidates were selected to undergo 3 (three) years Diploma Praveen Course (D.El.Ed) at Government Hindi Institute (GHI)Dimapur for the session 2020-21.
- 3. From September 14 to 21, 2020, Hindi Pakhwara (Fourth Night) was observed through online mode.
- 4. Due to Covid-19, classes were run through online for students at GHI Dimapur and final examination was conducted offline by maintaining Covid-19 SOP/Protocol as laid down by the government.
- 5. 15 (fifteen) students were admitted to BanasthaliVidyapith, Rajasthan in different class for the academic session 2020-21.

REPORT OF THE TEXT BOOK SECTION

- 1. Free Text Books were distributed to all the government schools from classes PP to VIII.
- 2. Modern Indian Language (MIL) Local Text Books for eighteen recognised Naga tribes were distributed to all the students from Class-1-8.

PLANNING SECTION

- 1. An amount of Rs.100.00 lakh (Rupees one crore) only is earmarked for printing of local dialect textbooks for elementary schools (Class I-VIII).
- 2. Under Negotiated Loan, an amount of Rs.350.00 (Rupees three crores fifty lakhs) only was provided for construction of GHS Nerhema Kohima, GHSS Ruzhukhrie Kohima, GHS Longching Mon and GHS Phoyisha Phek.
- 3. An amount of Rs.170 lakh (Rupees one crore seventy lakh) only under State Development fund was approved for construction of GHS Zunheboto, GHS Purana Bazaar, Dimapur., Directorate of School Education office building, construction of type-I staff quarter at GHS Kawoto Zunheboto, Repair and Renovation of GMS Zuikhu village, Dimapur., Repair and Renovation of GPS Station-I Tuensang, Repair and Renovation of Boys Hostel GHS Asukhomi Village and construction of security fencing at GMS Satsami village Zunheboto.

4. Training for Mathematics and Science Graduate Teacher (NEC).

The Department of School Education Nagaland in collaboration with Ramietech Solutions Kohima Nagaland successfully conducted the first phase of training for Math and Science Graduate Teachers for five districts viz; Kohima, Wokha, Zunheboto, Dimapur and Peren during 2019-20.

It was first launched from Kohima in the presence of Director School Education and other officials from the department.

The three-day training programme overwhelmingly witnessed the active participation from the teachers in their respective districts.

The second phase of the training will cover the remaining six districts viz, Mokokchung, Tuensang, Longleng, Mon, Phek and Kiphire to be commence shortly in a virtual mode. All training will be held online supported with the essential technical assistance required.



ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN BY ACADEMIC AND EVALUATION CELL DURING THE YEAR 2020

Education is the main tool that could be used to uplift the underprivileged and marginalized people permanently towards development and prosperity in life. All other social security measures being extended by the Govt. and NGOs could achieve their objectives only when the majority of the people from the society get quality basic education. Therefore, the Department of School Education has been introducing various innovative programmes for bringing paradigm changes in the quality of education being imparted at Govt. schools.

Teachers' Diary: In order to monitor and supervise performance of teachers and help them to develop their potentials and performance, the Department of School Education introduced 'The Teacher's Diary' in all Govt. Schools throughout the State from the March 2020.

Tele/Radio Online Education: When the COVID-19 Lockdown forced the school children to be away from normal learning activities, the Department of School Education has launched the innovative Online Digital Education in the State from the month of May 2020. Video/Radio broadcast of lessons for students classes 5 to 12 were done through Doordarshan, All India Radio, Youtube, Facebook and Jio TV.

It is worth mentioning that Nagaland is the first State in India to incorporate sign language interpretation in the video lessons broadcasted.

Online Evaluation Portal: As the conventional tools of evaluation could not be used during the period of COVID-19 crisis, the department has developed the Online Students Evaluation Portal which could be easily accessed through any Mobile/Laptop/PC and would work efficiently even in 2G internet connections. Three phases of Evaluation were conducted through the Online Evaluation Portal in the year 2020.

Online School Monitoring System: In order to ensure that the process of Continuous Learning is sustained in all Govt. Schools throughout the State, particularly in remote and rural areas, a 'Continuous Learning & Monitoring Cell' was constituted at the Directorate of School Education and the Cell coordinates the teaching–learning activities being carried out during the lockdown period through the newly developed Online School Monitoring System.

Online Teachers Transfer Portal: In order to ensure transparency in transfer of teachers, a separate Teachers' Online Transfer Portal was launched in the month of September 2020. The department solicited applications from teachers seeking transfer and will issue bulk Transfer Orders to eligible teachers well ahead of the commencement of new academic session.

Teacher's APP: In order to keep teachers updated with latest developments in the field of education and also to monitor the progress of their activities, the department launched the Teacher's APP in the month of September 2020.

Free India 4.0 Education: DoSE Nagaland in association with M/s iB Hubs , Hyderabad has launched the 'Free India 4.0 Education' project which benefits nearly 4000 students from economically backward families to pursue technology oriented computer education programme.

DHIKSHA Coherent Access Project: DoSE Nagaland in association with Central DHIKSHA Project Management Team will be broadcasting important video lessons to students appearing for the forthcoming HSLC, HSSLC and Class 11 Promotion Examination from January 2021 through the DHIKSHA platform.

Gurushala Teacher Training Programme: DoSE Nagaland in association with 'Pratham Education Foundation' implanted the Online Teacher Training and Professional Development initiative 'Gurushala' from December 2020 for all Govt. School teachers throughout the State wherein nearly 9500 teachers are enrolled and undergoing the training.

REPORT OF MID DAY MEAL SCHEME

1. Brief history of MDM and entitlement:

The Government of India introduced Mid Day Meal Programme under the Scheme entitled *"National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education* (NP-NSPE)' popularly known as **Mid Day Meal**. The Scheme was launched on 15th August 1995 in the whole country as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The scheme was extended from classes 6-8 during 2008-2009. This scheme is being implemented with the objective of increasing enrolment, retention, and attendance of children in schools and improving their nutritional status at the same time

The Scheme is being implemented in the State by the Department of School Education with active participation from the Village Education Committees (VECs), SMCs and NGOs.

2. <u>Implementation of Food Security Allowance (FSA)</u>: As per the directives from the MHRD, GOI vide letter F.No.1-2/2020 Desk (MDM) dated 29.04.2020, the department has been providing Mid Day Meal or in other words Food Security Allowance to the eligible children during closure of schools on account of COVID-19, and in summer vacation breaks, so as to ensure that the nutritional requirements of the eligible children covered under MDMS are met in order to safeguard their immunity which is vital during the wake of COVID-19 outbreak.

<u>Mechanism adopted</u>: The parents/guardians of the eligible children were asked to report in school on a specified date and then provided FSA which were pre packed following social distancing norms notified at various levels. The distribution was done in the presence of SMCs, VECs, Block level Officials, community members etc. Feedbacks were collected from the beneficiaries (from at least one teacher, parent, student, SMC, VEC), and the Department has received positive responses so far.

REPORT ON SAMAGRA SHIKSHA DURING 2020-21:

Till date, 1811 schools (91%) have completed the online Self-Evaluation dashboard.

External Evaluators consisting of Sr. SDEO/SDEO, AEO/JEO and SIS were appointed to cover all the 46 Blocks and they were assigned to visit 15 schools from each block and upload the information in the online External Evaluation Dashboard.

Rashtriya Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day):

The District Education Office, EBRC and schools from across the State observed the National Unity Day on 29th November 2020 by taking pledges and organizing related activities.



Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB):

44 schools (4 Schools from each district) were selected to implement Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat (EBSB). This program was paired with Manipur and Madhya Pradesh. EBSB Hindi and Manipuri booklet were translated into English, printed and distributed to all the selected schools. Students implemented this program by taking pledge on saving environment, reading simple sentences etc. in the partner states dialect and cultural song of Nagaland was sent to the partner States for the same.

> Kala Utsav Online Competition 2020.

The Kala Utsav Competitions 2020 was conducted from district to the National level on Online mode in view of the pandemic situation.

The program was jointly organized by the Ministry of Education, Department of School Education and Literacy and NCERT New Delhi. National level Kala Utsav Virtual mode was scheduled from 11th to 22nd January 2021.

The 18 participants from across the State participated in the National level Competition. They perform the Dance, Vocal Music and instrumental Music both Classical and traditional in the studio (live) at Highland Dawn Media (High School Junction) and for Visual Art 2D, 3D and Indigenous Toys and Games at RGHSS Multipurpose Hall.

Teacher's Quarter (Secondary):

Construction of 32 units of Residential Quarter for teachers was started with active participation of the SMDC members and community. Till date 3 units of the Residential Quarters have been completed.

To expediate the construction works, the State has opted for the prefab technology for construction of Teachers Quarters. A two



units of work have already been completed. In view of the progress, construction of the remaining Residential Quarter for Teachers with the same prefab technology will be taken up since it is cost effective and less time consuming.

Learning Enhancement Programme/Remedial teaching (Secondary): In view of the poor performance of students from government schools in the HSLC examination conducted by NBSE, three (3) months Remedial Teaching in Maths and Science was introduced for 240 GHS/ GHSS to cover 5324 students.



- ✓ Three months remedial teaching for Maths and Science subject class 10 was conducted from December 2019 to February 2020.
- ✓ The conduct of remedial teaching classes was monitored by the EBRC Coordinators in the block level and officials from State Mission Office Samagra Shiksha.
- ✓ 315 Science and Math teachers were
- \checkmark engaged.

Inclusive Education:

Assessment camps were conducted in 10 districts by two teams the objective of identifying and providing assistive devices to CWSN with hearing impairment and measurement for provision of artificial limbs, shoes and other devices for

children with locomotors. The Department also provided spectacles to the visually impaired children.



Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV):

At present the State has 12 functional KGBVs with 1118 girls enrolled. The students experience holistic development not only in academics but also in life skills and other extra-curricular activities.



> Play School:

Support for play schools is being provided in 450 primary schools in the four districts of Kiphire, Tuensang, Mon and Longleng in collaboration with Eleuthorous Christian Society, Tuensang.



Capacity building and Leadership Training:

3 days training programme was conducted for school heads at DUDA guest house Kohima from $21^{st}-23^{rd}$ January 2020 where 35 school heads attended the programme against the target of 50. 2 days training programme was conducted for Educational Administrators on 16^{th} & 17^{th} January 2020 at SIRD Hall Kohima



Youth and Eco clubs:

To create awareness and interest in preserving the environment, youth and ecoclubs were formed in 1987 in all government schools in the state.



Sochum and Laipang:

In collaboration with ECS, Tuensang and Lemasachenlok Society Longleng, Sochums and Liapang Centres have been introduced in the districts of Tuensang and Longleng.

Under these centres, resources of the community are tapped for providing of academic support and for development of the physical, cultural and social attributes of students. In the evening, children enrolled in Sochums and Laipang Centres learn life skills, culture and traditions of the village/tribe besides academic pursuits. Service of college students within the village is utilized to teach students.
