

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT

he Department of School Education manages with the Primary, Elementary, Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in the state. The department was established in the year 1964. Initially, Higher and Technical Education, Youth Resources and State Council of Education Research and Training (SCERT) were under the management of the 'Department of Education'. However, with the bifurcation of the above-mentioned branches with independent directorates, the nomenclature of the department of Education was re-named to 'School Education'.

Administrative set-up of School Education Department At the State level:

The Department of School Education and State Council Educational Research and Training is headed by the Chief Minister and Advisor. Presently, at the Executive level, Commissioner Secretary, to the Government of Nagaland is the Administrative Head of Department. The AHoD is assisted by Secretary, Additional Secretary, Joint Secretaries, Deputy Secretaries and Under Secretaries at the Secretariat.

Report from Academic & Evaluation Cell

Digital Teacher's Diary: The Department has changed the normal Teacher's Diary introduced in the year 2020 for monitoring the teaching- learning processes being carried out in Govt. Schools into 'Digital Teacher's Diary'. This will bring remarkable changes in the way of functioning of Government Schools in the State.

Personalised Adaptive Learning: The department in association with M/s Indiavidual Learning Limited, Bangalore, Karnataka implements Embibe New Age Personalised Adaptive Learning (PAL) platform on a pilot basis in 100 selected Government Schools from the academic year 2022.

IBM STEM Education: M/s YouthNet, Kohima, Nagaland has been implementing the IBM Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (IBM STEM) Education Programme in 69 (sixty nine) selected Government Schools to interested students on voluntary basis.


The **Nagaland Reading Festival** aimed to help students from Grades 1 to 8 read effectively with comprehension has been implemented under the NIPUN Bharat initiative through DIKSHA.

Innovative CSR Projects: The Department has been implementing many innovative projects for Students across the State in association with leaders of the industry and NGOs such as Ashoka Innovators for the Public, HCL Technologies, ChangeInnk Foundation, American India Foundation, IBM, and Educational Initiatives (Ei).

Recruitment and Mainstreaming of SSA/RMSA Teachers: The Department recruited 50 Mathematics and 89 Science Graduate Teachers during the year 2022 in order to address the issue of shortage of Maths and Science teachers in Government Schools. Results of the recruitment examination for recruitment of 58 Graduate Hindi Teachers will be declared after the stay order passed by the Hon'ble High Court is vacated. The Department mainstreamed 2290 Teachers appointed under SSA/RMSA into State cadre.

Chief Minister's Meritorious Students Fellowship Programme: Under the CMMSF Program, the best 50 top individual performers in the Class 10 Board Examination conducted by the Nagaland Board of School Education are awarded fellowship for a period of 5 years.

"Nagaland: Enhancing Classroom Teaching and Resources (NECTAR)"

About Performance Incentive Grants (PIG) 1st Batch

The World Bank is funding an Education Project namely The Nagaland Education Project-The Lighthouse (NECTAR) through the Department of School Education. One of the key components – **Governance and Capacity Building of Service Providers and Clients** is aimed at improving accountability mechanisms and community ownership under which grants are being made available for all government schools across the state.

Focusing on the strong culture of community led development in Nagaland, the project emphasizes to reinforce the relevance of "Communitisation" of schools and strengthen the community's role as guardians of public institutions. Lack of information and capacity of the School Management Committees (SMCs) and the School Management and Development Committees (SMDCs) to partner with the school system is a major issue. Therefore, to build capacity to enhance contestability and promote commitment of the SMCs and SMDCs the Performance Incentive Grant is being made available for all 1953 Government Schools in Nagaland through the SMCs and SMDCs that will support local needs proposed through "Action Plans" based on the school needs. The schools will be shortlisted in 3 batches and 738 schools have been selected in the first batch.

The active participation of the community through School Management Committees (SMCs) / School Management and Development Committees (SMDCs) is one of the key factors in the performance of government schools and improvement of learning environment. Therefore, in order to strengthen their capacities, the project aims to give financial support to eligible SMCs and SMDCs across the state. The financial support is called Performance Incentive Grants (PIG).

The PIGs, therefore, will focus on:

- a) Providing financial support to SMC/SMDC for improving the learning environment in schools.
- b) Strengthening the SMC/SMDC capacity to enhance their ownership and responsibility.
- c) Strengthening the community engagement and encouraging community contribution.

The incentive grant is structured with the cognizance that all the SMCs/SMDCs can potentially avail the grants. Hence, the incentive structure (for 2 years) accommodates the incentive grant for all the 1953 schools.

Implementation Plan

PIGs will be implemented in three batches from 2022 to 2026 for all the 1953 Government schools across Nagaland. Each batch will receive the grant in bi-annual tranches for a period of two years. Additional tranches can be considered beyond this period on needs basis and separate criteria/guidance will be developed to ascertain the conditions for extension.

Action Plan for SMCs/SMDCs:

Post the completion of the first capacity building workshop, the selected SMCs/SMDCs will have to submit their respective PIG Action Plans. The templates for the plans will be shared during the workshop. A PIG Action Plan will include details of the activities the SMC/SMDC plan to undertake over the course of the year along with the budget and projected timelines.

Monitoring Plan:

As part of the Performance Incentive Grants (PIG), a monitoring mechanism has been established for monitoring of the activities undertaken by SMCs/SMDCs during each tranche period of six months. This will ensure accountability of the activities conducted by the SMCs/SMDCs as per their proposed action plan. The monitoring will be done through various tools and templates that track monthly activity progress, details of community engagement activities, mid-term review, financial records, procurement process, monitoring visits and completion of the project. Financial trackers will ensure financial accountability and proper management of financial records. Likewise, procurement templates will ensure proper documentation of the procurements undertaken in the purview of government rules and regulations. The various tools and templates have been developed keeping a community centred perspective i.e. feasibility for the communities in operationalising the grant.

Inclusion of various stakeholders in the monitoring plan will be vital for validation of the activity outcomes and mark the completion of the work for each tranche. Hence, surprise monitoring visits will be undertaken by various representatives (PMU, PMC, DPAs) from NECTAR team to ensure verification and progress of the work, and further provide any course correction steps if required.

Most importantly, the District Administration will be required to oversee the monitoring of the SMCs/SMDCs at community level and undertake an end-term monitoring visit at the end of each tranche to ensure satisfactory completion of the proposed plans.

Completion and Sustainability Plan:


The District Administration will submit the completion report submitted at the culmination of the grant period which will also include a sustainability plan by SMCs/SMDCs to sustain the progress made through the PIG. The sustainability plan will map the progress made through PIG, innovations undertaken, identification of critical areas future interventions and projection of sources to fund these interventions especially through community contribution.

The completion reports submitted at the end will be collated at the end of the project to map innovations, gaps, challenges and other features of project implementation which emerge through the process. The completion reports will also act as the basis to evaluate the performance of SMCs/SMDCs.



<u>Training program for strengthening assessment in Nagaland by Educational Initiatives (EI) and PMU under Nagaland Education Project - The Lighthouse (NECTAR)</u>.

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 has emphasized the need for shifting the teaching, learning and assessment to competency-based education and away from 'rote learning'. The Department of School Education, Government of Nagaland, has taken steps to make the classroom transaction competency-focused as part of the larger mandate of the World Bank-aided Nagaland Education Project – The Lighthouse (NECTAR) to transform school examinations to attain global benchmarks. Evidence shows that good quality examinations can have a positive impact on learning outcomes by encouraging the teaching of curriculum through competency-based educational practices leading to development of a wider range of skills. Students who study under a good examination show a wider and more developed skill set and are better prepared for life.

Educational Initiatives (EI), in collaboration with Department of School Education as part of the Nagaland Education Project – The Lighthouse (NECTAR), conducted a training programme to strengthen assessments/examinations conducted by the Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE). Through this effort to strengthen examinations, the objective is that examinations will seek to focus on testing specific learning outcomes and competencies along with application and higher-order thinking skills, and provide meaningful, timely and actionable feedback on students' performance rather than testing rote-learning. This will in turn make an impact in improving the quality of teaching and learning that happens in the classrooms. The training programme brought together experts in the field of education assessments, Senior Officials from Nagaland Board of School Education (NBSE), State Council for Educational Research and Training (SCERT) and Directorate of School Education (DoSE), and teachers of various subjects from Govt and private schools across Nagaland for a four-day training from $17^{\rm th}$ to $20^{\rm th}$ January 2023.

The training focused on Art and Science of Question Making, Principles of Good Assessments, Principles of devising a Good Multiple-Choice Question (MCQ), MCQ-Making Activity and Principles of Review of MCQs.

The sessions also included Principles of devising a Good Constructed-Response Question (CRQ), Principles of Review of CRQs, Assessment and Learning Frameworks and Creating Systems for Collaborative Item Authoring and Review.

Report under P.M POSHAN (Mid Day Meal) Scheme

1.Brief history:

The Government of India introduced Mid Day Meal under the Scheme titled "National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education (NP-NSPE)'. The Scheme was launched on 15th August 1995 in the whole country as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme. The Scheme was extended from classes 6-8 during 2008-2009. The Scheme is being implemented with the objective of increasing enrolment, retention, and attendance of children in schools and improving their nutritional status at the same time. The nomenclature of Mid Day Meal Scheme is presently known as "Pradham Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman (PM-Poshan)" by the Ministry of Education Govt. of India, Department of School Education & Literacy vide F.NO.1-3-2021- Desk (MDM) dated 6th October 2021.

The Scheme is being implemented in the State by the Department of School Education with active participation from the Village Education Committees (VECs), SMCs and NGO.

The Rashtriya POSHAN Maah is celebrated from 1st September to 30th September by carrying out various activities such as plantation drives, cleanliness drives, POSHAN Assemblies held in virtual/physical mode to discuss malnutrition, its impact on society and value of healthy and balanced diet. Parent Teacher Meetings (PTMs) was held in online/offline mode by school class teachers with parents with regard to nutrition and its relationship to physical and mental health and wellbeing.

The purpose of SVP is to honor and award those schools who have undertaken exemplary work in the field of water, sanitation, and hygiene. SVP also provides a benchmark and roadmap for schools to make further improvements in the future. The programme is based on IT enabled assessment and was closely monitored by the Ministry of Education, GOI. The performance of the Schools were evaluated under 6 parameters:- Drinking Water, Toilets, Handwashing with Soap, Operation and Maintenance, Capacity Building, Covid-19 (Preparedness & Response)

The Awards are of different categories such as:- District Level, State Level and National Level. <u>District Level Awards</u> were open to all Five Star, Four Star and Three Star rated schools, <u>State Level Awards</u> were open for Five Star and Four Star Rated Schools and <u>National Level Awards</u> were open to only Five Star rated schools.

Annual Administrative Report. (Scholarship Section)

1. Pre-Matric Scholarship for Minority Students:- This scheme is 100% centrally sponsored with Direct Benefits Transfer (DBT) payment mode from the Ministry of Minority Affairs. For FY 2022-23, 48144 fresh and 64446 renewal applications were received by the State through National Scholarship Portal (NSP 2.0). However, only 7193 fresh and 13519 renewal applications were verified by the State.

Physical verification to 114 schools was carried out by the section in the all the districts.

2. Pre-Matric Scholarship belonging to Schedule Tribe Students studying in Class IX and X:This scheme has been implemented from the Financial Year 2015-16 under the ministry of Tribal Affairs. With the directive of the Government of India, from the year 2019 the Department has onboarded into- *Common Scholarship Portal*(State portal) through which the student can apply their applications online. For FY 2021-22, 1354 applications were received through the state portal and proposals have been sent to the Ministry for sanction.



- **3. Nagaland Govt. School Students Meritorious Award.(NGSSMA):-** This is a state sponsored scheme given to the merit Students studying in Govt schools of the state. NGSSM award is given to the meritorious students for the toppers passing out in different three stages of Exam i.e Primary Leaving Certificate Examination, Elementary Leaving Certificate Examination and High School Leaving Certificate. The department has disbursed Rs.13,15,000/- (RupeesThirteen Lakhs Fifteen Thousand only) for 389 merit students during 21-22.
- **4. Grant for children of Police personnel Killed in encounter while on duty:-** This scheme was implemented Vide O.M NO.FIN/ESTT/5-27/75 Dated 14th Jan' 1980. The Department has earmark Rs. 1 Lakh every year for this purpose from the allocated fund to Scholarship Section under Non-Plan. Since the allocation of amount is less, the Department pay as lump-sum for their admission and school fees for these students till class 10 provided the scholar is successful, and subject to his/her good progress record on (1) Regularity (ii) Good conduct and (iii) good academic result. During 2022-23 the Department has disbursed Rs. 60,000/- (Sixty Thousand only) to 4 (four) students through their Account.
- **5. Stipend to Students studying at Govt. Hindi Institute Dimapur:-** The Department gives Stipend to the Hindi Institute Students every year from the allocated fund under Scholarship by the State Govt. This is the only scholarship avail by the students studying in this institute. During 2022-23 the Department has disbursed Rs.3,09,600/- (Three Lakh Nine Thousand Six Hundred only) to 105 students through their Account.



NAGALAND BOARD OF SCHOOL EDUCATION ACHIEVEMENT REPORT 2022-2023

- 1. To meet the new challenges faced in the management of examinations, the Board has made suitable modifications and revised the *Rules for the Conduct of HSLC & HSSLC Examintions* with the approval of the Government of Nagaland [vide Govt. letter No.DSE/NBSE/15-2/2011-12/121 dated 16-02-2022]. The revised rules came into effect from the HSLC & HSSLC Examinations 2022 conducted in the month of March 2022, and is made available in the NBSE portal.
- 2. In keeping with the goal of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 to reach out to atleast 30% of learners to have exposure to vocational Education by 2025, the Board has introduced Vocational Education from Classes IX to XII from 2022 academic session in a phase manner. [Notification No. 18/21 vide letter No.NBE-4/Ad-VOC(10)/2021-22 dated 25th February 2021] Under this scheme, about 150 private schools is being covered.
- 3. In accordance with the directive of the Government of India, Ministry of Education, the Department of School Education & Literacy, Samagra Shiksha and NBSE jointly organized a webinar on *Board's Accommodations for Children with Special Needs (CWSN)* on 22nd February 2022. [Circular letter No.NBE-29/Ad-PWD/2021-22/220 dated 15th February 2022]
- 4. To provide equitable and inclusive education as envisaged in the National Education Policy 2020, NBSE has revised and made suitable modifications in the Curriculum and Examination system to meet the needs of *students with disabilities*. The Board has taken feedbacks from various stakeholders of the state and revised the rules with the approval of the Government of Nagaland. The revised rules is made available in the NBSE portal. [*Notification No. 30/22 vide letter No.NBE-29/Ad-PWD/2021-22/544 dated 21st March 2022*]
- 5. To empower the Heads of Institutions registered under NBSE to re-imagine learning and modernize education fit for the post-Covid world, the Board organized training on *School Leadership Program*, which comprised of 6 (six) modules, with one module planned every fortnightly in a dual-mode of offline/online sessions from 8th April 7th June 2022.
- 6. Schools registered under NBSE, observed World Environment Day by organizing different activities on the 4th June 2022 and 6th June 2022 (5th June being a Sunday), on the theme "Only One Earth" with the focus on "Living Sustainably in Harmony with Nature". Activities related to issues such as air pollution leading to various diseases, climate change including global warming were undertaken. [Notification No. 50/22 vide letter No.NBE-8/Ad-Misc(10)/2022-23 dated 24th May 2022]
- 7. Based on the recommendations of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 for a multidisciplinary approach to education, *Mathematics as an elective subject* was introduced in Higher Secondary *Arts stream* from the academic session 2022. Further, institutions were also encouraged to introduce more subjects at the higher secondary level, so that students will have more choice of subjects. [*Notification No.52/22 vide letter No.NBE-18/Ad-Misc(12)/2022-23/1132 dated 27th May 2022]*



- 8. The Board in collaboration with the National Stock Exchange Academy Ltd organized a one-day awareness program on *Financial Management Education* for students on 24th June 2022 at Greenwood School, Dimapur. [*Circular letter No.NBE-28/Ad-NSE/2021-22/1365 dated 15th June 2022*]
- 9. Due to the disruptions caused by the Covid-19 pandemic in the education system, schools were encouraged to follow measures/interventions to mitigate the learning loss of the students on the areas: Emphasis on foundational literacy, remedial classes, additional classes, lesson plan of the teachers, emphasis on teaching the core concepts and basics with clarity, activity assessment, due attention given to children with Special Needs and coordination with parents as supportive role in the education of their children. [Notification No. 68/22 vide letter No.NBE-8/Ad-Misc(10)/2022-23 dated 1st July 2022]
- 10. Students with Disabilities appearing at the Class VIII and IX Examinations 2022 were given due exemption. [Notification No. 73/22 vide letter No.NBE-29/Ad-PWD/2022-23/1745 dated 19th July 2022]
- 11. The Board and the Nagaland State AIDS Control Society (NSACS) jointly conducted a two days online training programme under the *Adolescence Education Programme* on 25th and 26th August 2022, to provide accurate age appropriate life skills based adolescence education in a sustained manner in schools, and to provide structured education to enhance knowledge and skills of adolescents to deal with challenges of life. [*Circular letter No.NBE-5/Ad-AE(10)/2022-23/2176 dated 11th August 2022*]
- 12. To reduce the curriculum content load and enhance experiential learning as envisaged in the National Education Policy 2020, NBSE had *rationalised the topics* in the core subjects of *Social Sciences, Mathematics* and *Science* at the secondary level from the academic session 2022, in line with the National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) rationalised syllabi. [Notification No. 80/22 vide letter No.NBE-1/Ad-CS(10)/2022-23/2188 dated 12th August 2022]
- 13. To ease the burden of all stakeholders, *NBSE mobile app* (downloadable from Google Play Store) was developed for filling up the Application Forms for the ensuing HSLC & HSSLC Examinations 2023, which is in addition of doing it directly from the NBSE portal. [*Notification No.98/22 vide letter No.NBE-14/Ex-Misc*(12)/2022-23/2509 dated 22nd September 2022]
- 14. As per the recommendations of the National Commission of Protection and Safety of Child Rights (NCPCR) highlighted in their *Safety and Security Manual and Guidelines for Schools*, all schools registered under NBSE were directed to constitute a School Safety Committee to ensure psychological and social safety of students. [Notification No. 106/22 vide letter No.NBE-8/Ad-Misc(10)/2022-23/2661 dated 13th October 2022]
- 15. In accordance with the recommendations of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Board will be introducing *two levels of Mathematics question papers* from the *HSLC Examination 2024*, to allow some students to do their subject at a standard level and some at a higher level, according to their choice, so as to reduce pressure on examination. [*Notification No. 115/22 vide letter No.NBE-1/Ad-CS(10)/2022-23/2841 dated 9th November 2022*]



- 16. The Board has issued guidelines to the Heads of Intuitions on some concerns for schools to adopt corrective measures wherever necessary for the welfare of the students, in the areas: Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act 2012, Behavioural Problems, Mental Health, Internet Usage, Substance Abuse and Tobacco use, Junk Food, Bullying and Ragging, Moral Values, Corporal Punishment, School Uniform, Infrastructure and facilities. [Circular letter No.NBE-8/Ad-Misc(10)/2022-23/2710 dated 20th October 2022]
- 17. In line with the vision of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPWD) Act, 2016 for equitable and inclusive education, the Board in collaboration with Changeinkk Foundation had launched a *Specific Learning Disability (SLD) Helpdesk* on NBSE's portal on 3rd December 2022. The SLC Helpdesk is a chatbot that provides support to parents, teachers and students in the state and address all queries related to SLD such as dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia and dyspraxia. [*Circular letter No.NBE-29/Ad-PWD/2022-23/2974 dated 2nd December 2022*]
- 18. To make examinations/assessments stress-free and student friendly, as envisaged in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the Board *revised the Management of Examinations and incorporated New Rules* which were approved by the Governing Body of the Board on 5.12.2022 for implementation from the HSLC & HSSLC Examinations 2023. These revised/new rules were put up for the approval of the Government on 14th December 2022. [*Vide letter No.NBE-14/Ex-Misc(12)/2022-23 dated 14th December 2022*]
- 19. To create further awareness on Specific Learning Disability (SLD), the Board along with Changeinkk Foundation organized a two days webinar for all Heads of Registered Institutions on 23rd and 24th January 2023, to learn strategies on how to improve learning outcomes by enabling inclusive classrooms that allow students with learning disabilities to thrive. [*Circular letter No.NBE-29/Ad-PWD/2022-23/71 dated 12th January 2023*]
- 20. In the year 2022, 28938 students appeared for High School Leaving Certificate (HSLC) Examination, out of which 18721 were declared qualified. In the same year, 17121 students appeared for Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) Examination, and 13989 students were declared passed.
- 21. A total of 3369 students appeared in the Compartmental Examination for HSLC (2022 Batch), out of which 1982 students were declared qualified.


